UPCOMING SCHOOL BOND

Shila Clark shared some information that she learned about the Feb. 13th bond from the the Superintendent. If the bond passes, CAM will have a new building built near 72nd AVE and 199th ST. The district already owns the property. They envision a building that houses the offices and a multi-purpose room big enough to hold all students at once. There will be two wings consisting of 10-plex modulars. They will be well built and well wired for our technology needs. They know that ample parking and easy road access are important. They plan for CAM to have a ball field and playground. Eventually, RHL might move there too. There are some wetlands that the science teachers could use for outdoor learning. CAM does not qualify for matching funds from the state because it is currently in a leased building. The district pays \$500,000 a year to lease it, and it is a priority to own all buildings.

Discussion:

- What would the long houses be like: regular sized classrooms, reliable bathrooms, science labs, 1 door at each end of central hallway with five classrooms on each side, maybe 3rd-6th grades and 7th/8th LA/Hist teachers in one, 7th/8th Math/Sci and HS classes in other one.
- Will all ALE schools eventually be at this new location? River Homelink(probably), Summit High School(probably not)
- Discussed having district reps come to CAM to talk to parents. Will see if if they can come on Feb. 6th.
